




Next step in this direction is to organize an All India Sanskrit Women Scholars' Conference to highlight the significant contributions of women Sanskrit scholars and the philosophy of empowerment of women in Sanskrit literature. The list of other activities of the Vidyapeetha including the introduction of a number of Innovative Courses and Special Assistance

Programmes (SAP) in various subjects that brought laurels to the institution is also long and encouraging.

ADDRESS OF CHANCELLOR:

I congratulate Prof. H K Satapathy for his renomination as the Vice-Chancellor of the Tirupati Rashtriya Sanskrit University. Under his stewardship this University has made phenomenal progress. It has acquired a certificate of excellence. The duty of a Vice-Chancellor is to create an inspiring leadership among the teaching and non-teaching staff and the students of the University. There should be total cooperation and cordiality among the members of the University. Our age is a competitive one and all of us should see that this University does not fall behind both in terms of qualitative and quantitative progress.

This University has maintained that atmosphere of peace, cooperation and cordiality as a result of which, during the last few years many new studies have been introduced and buildings come up to accommodate them. Many useful and important publications have come out in order to commemorate the Golden jubilee year of the University. University Grants Commission is much impressed with its progress and the Government of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development has come out generously to meet the needs of the University. The University has a plan to prepare and publish a multilingual dictionary of Indian languages, which would be a unique one of its kind.

The University is not just an institution to issue degree and doctorate certificates. It must be a storehouse of knowledge, disseminating knowledge to all seekers, coming under its portals. It must produce excellent teachers in order to educate the masses living outside, particularly the illiterate and the half-literate. In our country, today, we have several IITs, more than 500 Universities and many famous Central Institutes of Research and Development.

But the ranking, however, of our Universities in the world is still deplorable. According to Times Higher Education supplements our IITs ranked 50th in the world, IIMs 84th and the famous JNU is placed as 192nd. China is far ahead of us. The Beijing University is ranking 15th in the world.

In ancient times, students were attracted from all over the world to study in our Universities like Nalanda, Takshyashila, Pushpagiri etc.

Today, hundreds of thousands of Indian students are leaving the country for better education to Universities abroad; to Australia, England and the USA. There has been a lot of brain drain in the past. Now the country is making rapid progress and there is no reason why we cannot build world class universities and offer attractive jobs to our doctors, engineers, technicians, scientists and teachers so that they could be fully absorbed in the country's ever expanding economy. When we talk of our educational institutions, they must include the primary and secondary ones, which constitute the foundation of the entire system.

Secondly, while we emphasise on producing more scientists, engineers, doctors and technicians as the country needs a lot many of them, we should not neglect the humanities. A lot more attention should be paid to teaching of subjects like History and Philosophy, the Modern Indian Languages and the study of Sanskrit which is the source of all Indian languages. Some people argue that jobs are few and not so attractive to students in these fields. But this is not true. Let me talk of Sanskrit Universities like this Vidyapeetha. Don't we need people



well educated in Pourihitya, in Vastu, in Ayurveda, in Yoga Vigyan, in ecological science etc? Besides one should not forget one's cultural roots which are morally and ethically sound. Men should not turn into machines to do their exacting jobs in our so-called IT age.

Big jobs yes. Big slaves no.

I would appeal to our planners that school education which is the foundation of our higher education of Science and Technology or Humanities should contain a minimum knowledge of Sanskrit which teaches us to be a civilized and cultured human being. Therefore, Sanskrit should be a compulsory subject in school education particularly in our secondary schools. Sanskrit teaches us to be humble.

Education should be inclusive and not limited to the privileged few. बहुजनहिताय, बहुजनसुखाय । These are immortal teachings relevant to man in all ages.

Lastly I appeal to the Snatakas that they should continue to have an open mind and relentless quest for knowledge. They should remember that they are the proud citizens of a great country which expects them to give more than what they have received from the society. Service to fellow men can only boost their energy and intellectual persuits can sharpen their intellect. They should live their life with simplicity, dignity and self-respect.

International Naturopathy Organization, Chennai, and other subject experts.





SPECIAL FOCUS ON SCRIPT & SCRIPTURAL GALARY

It deals with the evolution of Indian languages. The project is an extension of the earlier project on ancient Indian scripts. It is well known that Indian scripts have their origin in the Brahmi script. The origin and development of various scripts of India, the different stages of evolution, the different language families, literary and archaeological evidences etc. is the subject matter of this gallery. It is of particular interest to Sanskrit students studying Manuscriptology and Palaeography, as it provides the basis of their study and research. The "Lipivikasa Pradarshini" is a laboratory for knowing the origin of different scripts for the benefit of more than 1000 students of Vidyapeetha , in addition to other dignitaries or other visitors from various places from India. It is located in the academic building of the Vidyapeetha.

SCRIPTURAL GALLERY; Objectives:

The aim is to educate the common people on the different Philosophical and Sastra Concepts available in Sanskrit by adopting a simple language. This is done by introducing the basic concepts, with the help of simple definitions, pictures, diagrams etc., such that even beginners also can easily understanding the philosophical, cultural concepts in an easy manner. 
