From the Vice Chancellor's Desk . . .



Swami Vivekananda's 150th Birth Anniversary and Youth Talent Festival in Tirupati.

The whole nation is celebrating the 150th birth anniversary of the most dynamic "Karma Yogi" of India during which a series of programmes are being organized in various places of the country and abroad. Swami Vivekananda's plan, programmes and activities were not only confined to the geographical boundaries of our country, the same travelled beyond the boundaries leaving an everlasting impact upon the thinking process and working style of so many western scholars. After hearing the electrifying address of Swamiji, the cyclonic Yogi of India, in 1893 in Chicago's World Parliament of Religion, one of the eminent professors of Harvard University (Prof. John Wright) observed – "Here is a person who is more learned than all the learned Professors of Harvard University, put together."

Swami Vivekananda wanted to project the real worth and significance of India in an emphatic manner in Western countries and he achieved success in his mission. Being an impartial appreciator of the good qualities of all countries and communities irrespective of their race or religion, Swamiji desired to promote the science and technology advanced in the Western country in his own motherland, India along with its spiritual development. He wanted the youth of his country not to cry but to roar like lions on the surface of the earth. That's why he gave a clarion call – "give me few men and women, who are young, honest, pure and perfect ; I can shake this entire world." His mission was to eradicate the poverty and starvation through dedicated human service ; to create an atmosphere of mutual fellow-feeling and co-existence through the promotion of Vedanta Philosophy, that preached the existence of god-hood in each and every particle of the Universe and beyond and to build India as a spiritual master and most advanced nation by synthesizing the spiritualism with science and technology. To him, science and spirituality are the two facets of the same coin. If science is a flower, spiritualism is its fragrance. His vision was to stand on the

strong foundation of the east, look at the west and get the best. This is one of the causes for which he descended on the earth and tried to translate these ideas into reality by undertaking so many service-oriented activities.

Swami Vivekananda wanted everybody to be good and to do good to others. For doing this noble work, one requires the positivisation of the mindset and Swamiji always advised the youth to get themselves dissociated from the negative thoughts. Negative thoughts like lust, greed, anger, arrogance, jealousy and hypocrisy, narrow-mindedness etc. are the real obstacles in the path of progress of both an individual and nation. Once the internal divine power gets manifested, all the negative qualities will disappear and the positive properties will take their place. Hence Swamiji observed that the main function of education is to ensure the manifestation of the divine qualities present within the man. He thought that youth power is nation's power. In fact, the development of a nation depends upon the proper channelization of youth power. Swami Vivekananda linked this proper channelization with the scriptural injunctions. Our ancient Indian scriptures (in Sanskrit) are united in emphasising one cardinal component of life i.e. truth ; that requires to be professed by one and all for the development of complete personality.

The main purpose of the celebration of the 150th birth anniversary of Swami Vivekananda is to initiate the youth of this country with the philosophy and ideology of Swamiji ; so that they can rise to the occasion to serve the mankind with greater commitments. We have prepared a pledge containing ten points to be administered to one and all, particularly to the youth, for motivating them to rededicate themselves to the cause of their motherland. The organization of seventh edition of All India Sanskrit Students' Talent Festival (AISST) in our University on this occasion of the celebrations of 150th Birth Anniversary of Swamiji with a new flavor and renewed vigour is a right pointer in this regard. Festival has been organized, talents have been show-cased ; ideas have been exchanged ; atmosphere has been surcharged ; brotherhood has been vibrated and Swamiji has been remembered. The participants have gone back with some sweet memories after taking an oath in the temple town of Tirupati to rededicate themselves to cause of nation building.

Vivekananda's vision was that of the Vedic seers that relied upon Sanskrit and ancient Indian knowledge system. His Guru, Swami Ramakrishna Paramahansa was an incessant source of his strength and inspiration. A two day National Seminar on "Global Aesthetics and Alankara Sastra", was jointly organized by Sahitya Akademi, New Delhi and Rashtriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, Tirupati on 26th and 27th December, 2012. This literary seminar on aesthetic element in comparative literary criticism from Global perspective was attended by more than 30 national reputed scholars from different states of the country.

Inaugurating the Seminar Mahamahopadhyaya Prof.Pullela Sriramachandrudu, Convenor, Sanskrit Advisory Board, Sahitya Academy brought a beautiful comparison between the Panchakosha Theory of the Taittiriya Upanishad and the five Kavyatma Vadas in the tradition of Ancient Alankara Sastra. He also quoted that **Rasananda** or Aesthetic experience is equivalent to **Brahmananda**. "रसो वै सः रसं ह्येवायं लब्ध्वाऽऽनन्दीभवति".

Delivering the key-note address Prof.Radha Vallabh Tripathy, Vice-Chancellor, Rashtriya Sanskrit Samsthan, New Delhi, reiterated that all Indian Aesthetic concepts are interrelated and they all revolve around the pivotal access of Rasa, Alankara, Guna, Riti, Vritti, Dhvani and Auchitya.

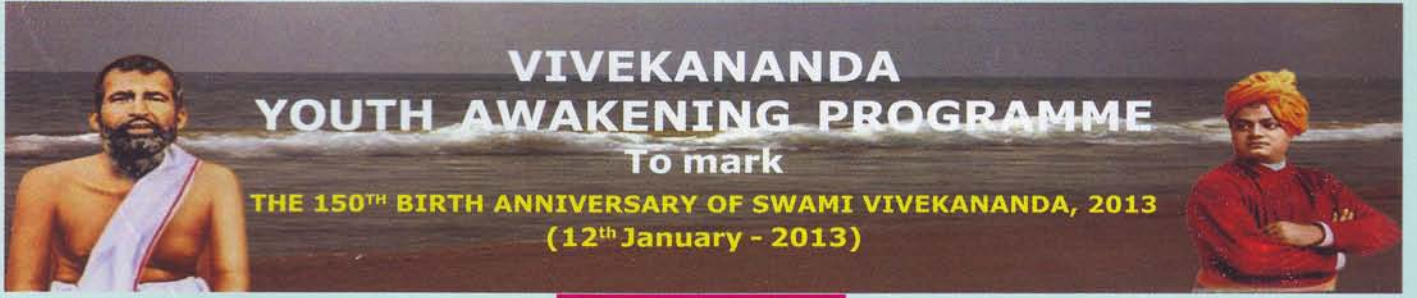

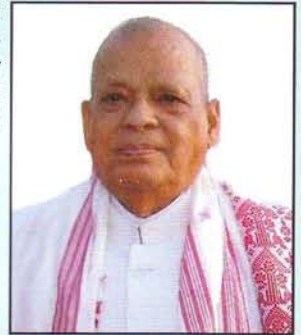

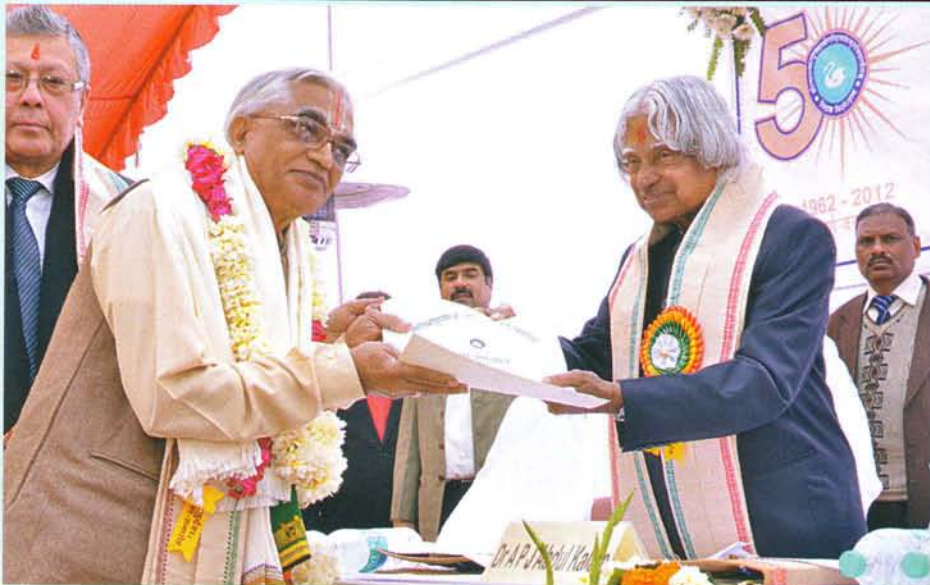
