Institution has created an eco-system for innovations including Incubation centre/ Research Labs/Manuscript repositories/subject based networks/teaching learning centers (TLC)/MOOCS studio/NRC and other initiatives for creation and transfer of knowledge.

National Sanskrit University has always given impetus to various kinds of innovations ever since its inception. The University holds a unique status among traditional Sanskrit Universities for successfully completing an E-PG Pathasala program at PG level (Acharya Sanskrit - Vyakarana) with 534 modules.

The University is also part of the Sanskrit Education and Research Network which is envisaged to comprehensively address all issues related to teachers, teaching, teaching material preparation and professional development.

The University Library houses a collection of over 6000 manuscripts pertaining to various subjects like Sahitya, Vyakarana, Jyotisa, Nyaya, Vedanta etc in various scripts like Devanagiri, Grantha, Sarada, Nandinagiri etc. In order to protect and preserve this treasure, a *Manuscripts Preservation Centre* has been established in the Library University. https://nsktu.ac.in/index.php/manuscript-catalogue/

The University has a state-of-the-art studio established solely for the purpose of creating an eco-system for all modes of learning. In the past, various Sastric recorded were under the **Ford Foundation** Stalwarts and dovens of Sanskrit https://nsktu.ac.in/index.php/video-gallery-2/ Sastras contributed greatly in the aforementioned project. During the first decade of the 21st century, the University obtained the Centre of Excellence in Sastras wherein a lot of recordings in various Sastras by various scholars took place. The famous Sastravaridhi project was conceived during this period and most of the admitted students in this project are now working as professors/teachers in various educational institutions. This in itself is a kind of incubation to produce valid teachers of Sastra who can carry forward the baton of traditional Sastric teaching/learning. https://nsktu.ac.in/index.php/centre-of-excellence-in-traditionalshastras/

Having witnessed the overwhelming result from the **Sastravaridhi project** the University has realised the dire need of setting up a Centre exclusively for the promotion and propagation of Sastras. As a result, the *PARAMACHARYA CENTRE FOR SASTRA PARIRAKSHANA KENDRAM* was established for the sole purpose of taking forward the traditional method of Sastra learning/teaching. The University has recently called upon its teaching fraternity to take up/create

modules on the MOOCs' platform and many faculty members came up with various proposals. The proposals have been submitted to UGC and await approval.

The University realises the dearth of quality Sanskrit teachers available in the country and has taken appropriate steps to ensure that the inmates of the University become quality teachers of the future. To ensure this, the Department of Education has a compulsory **INSERVICE TEACHER TRAINING** program as part of its B.Ed and M.Ed programs. This particular feature makes the students equipped for the challenges they face as future educators.

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
